Celebrating Ivy Tech students all week long

The week of May 5, 2024 was nothing short of memorable for Ivy Tech Sellersburg graduates. This year, the campus presented commencement in a remarkable fashion; instead of hosting one ceremony to celebrate all 1852 graduates, 5 ceremonies were held across 4 days at Huber's Winery in Starlight, Indiana. Each ceremony celebrated a unique set of students, making each ceremony special, intimate, and memorable for each student and family in attendance.

On Monday, May 6, Ivy Tech Sellersburg celebrated 879 students who graduated from the School of Arts, Sciences & Education, 753 of whom were dual credit students (134 associate degrees, 619 Indiana College Core certificates). Dual credit opportunities allow students to graduate from high school with certificates and/or associate degrees. Ivy Tech Sellersburg's dual credit program has saved the community \$9,128,422 this year alone. Students who are able to save time and money on their associates degrees through dual credit can enter 4-year universities as juniors or enter the workforce with the confidence, skills, and knowledge they will need to be successful.

Students who graduated from Schools of Business (146), Entrepreneurship (30), Information Technology (76), Advanced Manufacturing, Engineering & Applied Sciences (189), and Public Affairs, and Social Services (46) celebrated their accomplishments on Tuesday, May 7. Health Science graduates (292) enjoyed their commencement ceremony on May 8, and Nursing graduates (194) on May 9.

Furthermore, The Ivy Tech Foundation celebrated their Benefactor of the Year at each commencement, which honors individuals, corporations, and foundations from Indiana for their gifts and volunteer contributions to the college. This year, Ivy Tech celebrated Martin Padgett, CEO of Dr. Black's Eye Associates as the 2024 Benefactor of the Year. Padgett was awarded the 2024 Ivy Impact Award earlier this year and is an active member of the Sellersburg Campus Board of Trustees.
